## How are we helping the community during the lockdown period:

- Distributing **fresh products, gift voucheers** and **food parcels** to needy families

- The field workers, ECD teachers and Light Houses are in contact with our children's households and surrounding community to determine **emergency situations** and **need**.
- We **equip** and **uplift** our staff and personel (socially and spiritually)
- We have **Planning sessions** together with our staff, fieldworkers and ECD personel
- We are still launching our **special projects** for example our yearly **Winter Project** to distribute track suits, sleeping bags, underwear and rain jackets to our beneficiary children.

What is in your hand? What do you have to give to those who are less privileged? During this lockdown period, I realise that it is my choice to be miserable on my own or to sow that which is in my hand to give. I have a phone, a vehicle and know a whole host of people. I'd really like to help there where the need for the bare basics is the greatest. I contact a local ministry, Ma's-vir-Wellington, and mention that I'd like to support them to provide food to families in need. I had sent out a fewWhatsapps, and within 24 already had workers, cool storage, vehicle, storage space and packaging available. Within 48 hours the first load of oranges, sweet potato, aubergines, onions and meat was distributed to 12 families, 5 informal soup kitchens, 9 foster care homes and an orphanage.

I want to thank Ma's-vir-Wellington for your unselfish work and amazing attitude, for standing up in a time of need and to put your own lives on the line to serve a community. Thank you for being obedient to build up an organization through relationships, structures and integrity, so that you can be a safe and responsible channel through which help could be channelled. I honour the way in which you do not only look after your own concerns, but also are a channel of provision for schools, orphanages, old age homes, care homes and many soup kitchens. You are truly a source of hope for the community. What you do reflects the greater Hope in you.
