We had a very successful winter project with each of the children receiving the following: tracksuit/socks/rainjacket/sleepingbag/waterboots/beanie/jersey/underwear/blanket.

We also celebrated fathers for playing such an important role in a child's life and honoring grandfathers/uncles who step into the role of a father figure in the absence of father in the household.

We were blessed with a lot of visitors from all over the world, e.g., Ireland, America, Germany, Africa, India, Mexico, etc., We are thankful for the testimonies we could share with them about the goodness of God, as well as building new relationships, networking, giving them hope and doing Kingdom work.

SUPERSTERRE ECD



A child that feels safe and trusts their caregivers and teachers are more likely to learn, retain information and develop holistically. The Ma's vir Wellington ECD assistants and office personnel did a full training session with Walk with Wounded Children. A course with Stand Firm.



This training kicked off the focus of the term: Relate, regulate and relationship. The team did weekly exercises to relate to one another, reflect on our own and others state of mind and regulate emotions. These exercises were then implemented in the classroom to ensure that children can also regulate their emotions, and decrease their cortisol levels, for effective learning.

This quarter as we focused on healthy living and safety, we had visits from Right to Care Community Care practitioners to administer Vid A and deworming tablets, and the Hear X Foundations to screen more than 35 of our children.

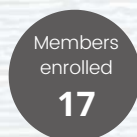


It was a blessed term with the Avodah group. They are nicely settled in at the Le Bac venue and enjoy the freedom, fresh air and tranquil environment to partake in our programs. We had many visitors from overseas (USA, Germany, and different African Countries) visiting our programs. They come to visit our programs to learn more about how we work with disabled persons, to impart some advice and just to love our members.



We have the opportunity to do physical exercises (gross motor skills) twice a week. Nelea Steyn and Rosemary Jonck take turns to vigilantly exercise the members' bodies. The exercises are worked out by a professional Pilates constructor to promote their strength, balance muscle development, flexibility, and increased the range of motion for the joints. They also do cardio exercises through simple aerobics, dancing, walking, active drumming sessions and other gross motor activities such as playing soccer and doing boeresport activities. Birthdays were celebrated and they were treated by some birthday cake and a small gift.

We currently have 6 people volunteering at our Avodah program for disabled persons, 14 ladies at the Children's Ministry, 6 ladies at the ECD classes and 19 ladies at the Prayer team.

Every term we have a function for these volunteers, to honor them for their time and commitment. We call it our WOW days - where **Women of Worth** fill their own cups with the Word of God, love and appreciation.

We were so blessed to held this terms' WOW morning at Langkloofrose. It is always such a blessing to visit this beautiful rose farm where 55 women in total, could celebrate life together. Two of our volunteers passed away this term. These ladies have served us for the past 15 years. We honour them for their love and commitment to our children and programs.

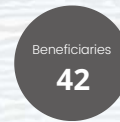
