Children receives a gift to celebrate their special birthday gifts day. Various community projects collects and distributes christmas gifts personalised gifts of essential items and treats for children in our programs. Basic first aid is provided to children as needed. We first aid collaborate with Health organizations for administering vitamin injections, and deworming tablets.

- To provide holistic physical, intellectual, emotional, and social care for 3–4-year-old children through age-appropriate activities, based on Biblical foundations.
- To help the children to build healthy relationships with peers, parents, and adults within a loving environment.
- To reduce malnourishment and neglect by providing healthy meals and physical need support.
- To safeguard and promote their overall wellbeing by doing home visits, providing basic first aid and by reporting abuse and neglect.

- To assist parents in enrolling their children into the schooling system.
- To safeguard and promote the overall wellbeing and health of the children by providing nutritious meals and basic first aid, doing home visits and by reporting abuse and neglect.

## INTELLECTUALLY DISABLED ADULTS

## **Project Goals**

To create a safe environment for members to improve their self-worth, personal development and belonging.

## **Project Objectives**

 Creating a safe space for 20 physically and intellectually disabled persons in the Wellington-area where they are accepted and feel safe to develop healthy relationships with God, peers and other adults.

• Mentoring members in biblical values to build their character.

• Three weekly creativity sessions where members can enjoy themselves and develop their own creative skills to reach their full potential and social skills.

 Supporting parents in their challenge to care for their disabled children by connecting them with other organisations in the Wellington/Paarl area every three months.



#### FINANCIAL INFORMATION FOR THE ANNUAL REPORT - 28 FEB 2023


- The annual financial statements for the year ended 28 February 2023 was successfully audited and all statutory compliance requirements met.
